

# Andres Duany + PlaceMakers + Salt Lake City + September 16



## ***Reserve your Place Today!***

The Utah League of Cities and Towns will host a day-long series on placemaking and form based codes on Thursday September 16<sup>th</sup>, as part of its 103<sup>rd</sup> Annual Conference at the Sheraton Hotel in Salt Lake City.

Renowned urban planner and architect Andrés Duany will start the day's events at 8:00 a.m. with a keynote address. (1 APA CM approved)

Duany founded Duany Plater Zyberk & Company (DPZ) in 1980, and became a leader in the national movement called the New Urbanism, which seeks to end suburban sprawl and urban disinvestment. DPZ received international recognition in the 1980s as the designer of Seaside, Florida, and has completed designs and codes for over 200 new towns, regional plans, and community revitalization projects. Duany is also a co-founder and emeritus board member of the Congress for the New Urbanism, established in 1993. He has co-authored two books: "Suburban Nation: The Rise of Sprawl and the Decline of the American Dream" and "The New Civic Art."

Following Mr. Duany's presentation the team from PlaceMakers will be conducting hourly sessions for the remainder of the day. PlaceMakers is a unique collection of professionals — planners, designers, architects, an attorney, an MBA, a journalist and a marketing communications veteran — who've committed to translating time-tested principles into purposeful efforts for quality growth. The PlaceMakers sessions include:

- **Session 4:** Making Form-Based Codes Work in a Small Town with Limited Resources (1 APA CM)

The PlaceMakers team will also be available Thursday morning for private consultation sessions if your city or town has specific questions for them. Consultations times are quite limited and you can sign up for a session at the conference registration desk beginning at 7:30 the morning of the 16<sup>th</sup>. Much of the agenda on the 16<sup>th</sup> is dedicated to a wide variety of land use topics in addition to what is noted above. The fee to register for just this one day is \$115 for those from member cities and towns (non member fees are also offered).
